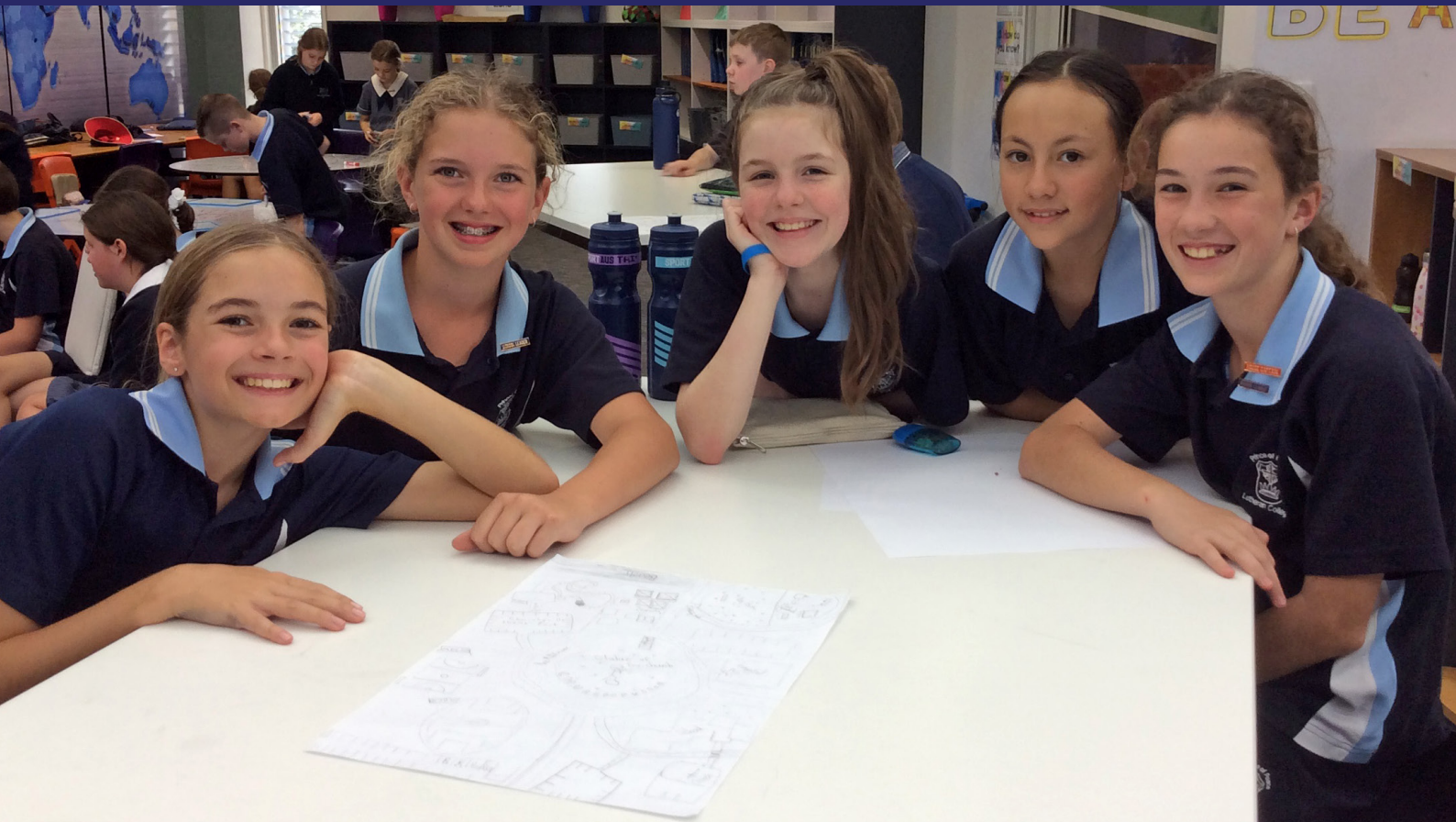

OVERALL PARENT SATISFACTION

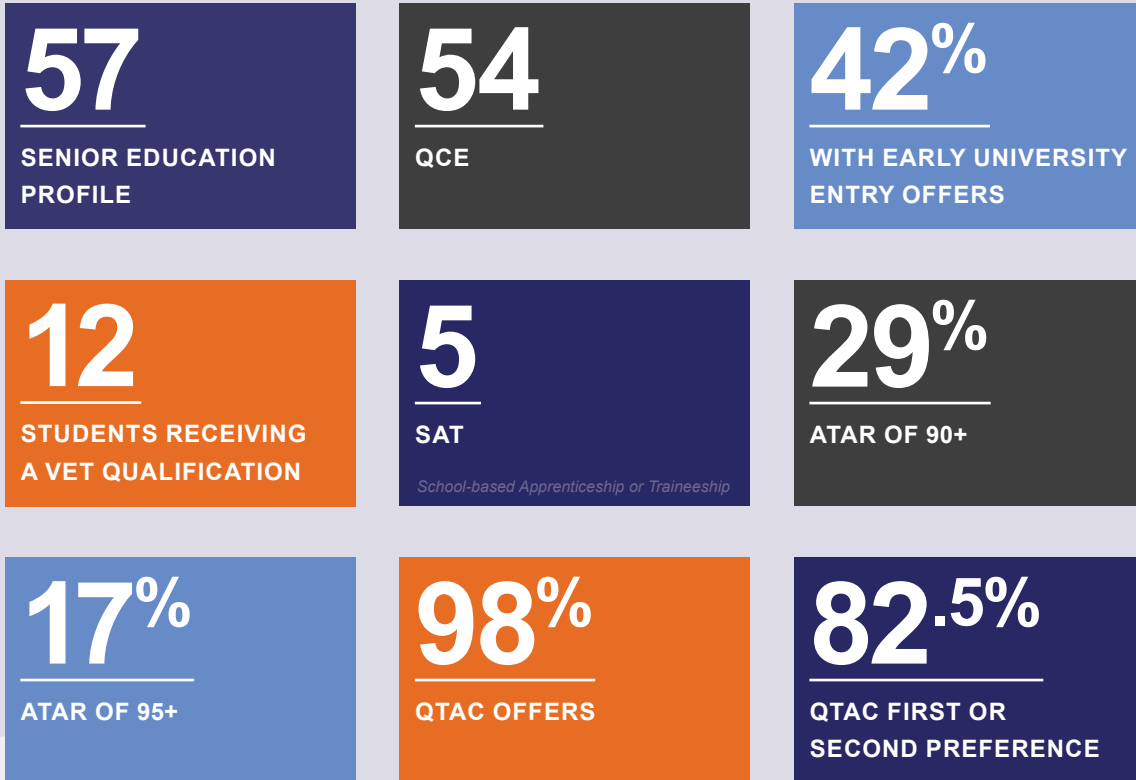

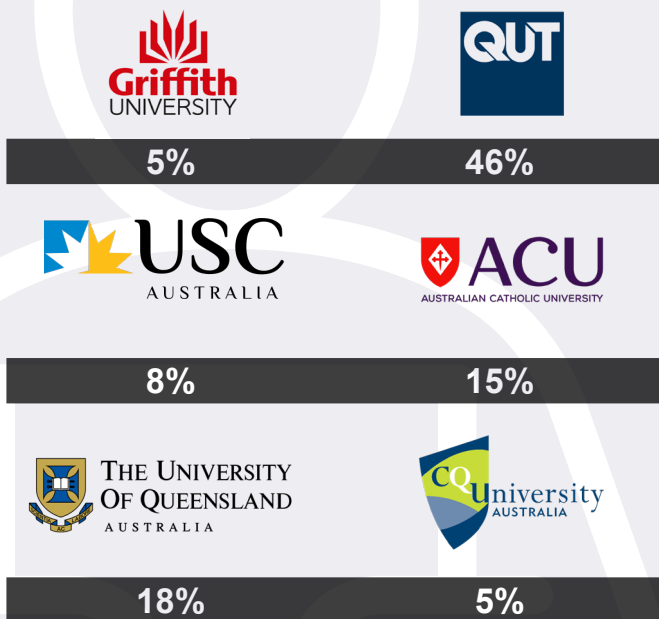
OVERALL STAFF SATISFACTION

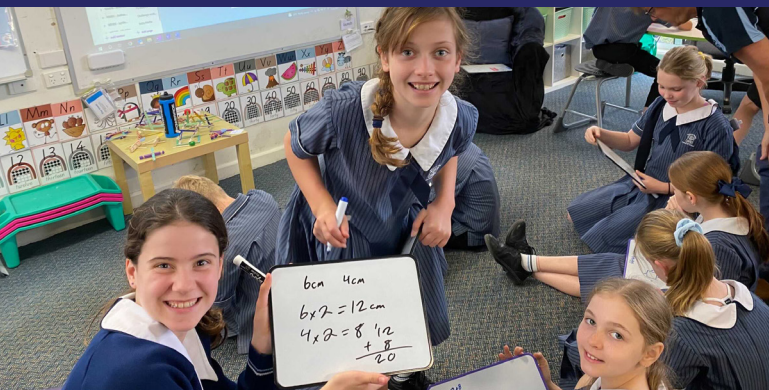
Next Step Destination Survey 2022

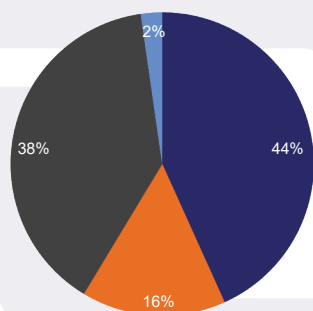
