

Learning Support Special Needs Aide (Secondary Students) Years 7 - 12

1. Overview

Prince of Peace Lutheran College is a co-educational, independent, Christian school located at Everton Hills in the north-western suburbs of Brisbane. The College was established by the Prince of Peace Lutheran Congregation in 1984 to provide quality Christian education to the children of the community.

Prince of Peace Lutheran College offers classes on two sites from Kindergarten to Year 12. The Junior Campus (K-6) is located at 20 Rogers Parade West, Everton Hills. The Senior Campus, 1 km away at 25 Henderson Road Everton Hills, was opened in July 2009 and is currently home to Years 7 – 12.

Prince of Peace Lutheran College is committed to addressing the needs of each student to enable them to reach their academic, social, emotional and physical potential within a Christian environment. For students diagnosed with special needs, these areas of development are specifically addressed through an Individual Education Plan or modified program. A major role of the Learning Support Special Needs Aide is to assist with the implementation of these programs. The role also involves supporting students with learning difficulties.

3. Conditions

4. Role Description

The successful applicant will be expected to:

- 4.1 Work with individual or small groups of students within the classrooms targeting cognitive, behavioral and social goals of the students' programs.
- 4.2 Prepare resources for use by students with modified programs.
- 4.3 Undertake debriefing of students as required.
- 4.4 Monitor and support individual or small groups of students, withdrawn for study support.
- 4.5 Collect data for the evaluation of targeted goals and strategies.

5. Key Areas

- 5.1 Be responsible for the implementation of programs and procedures for children with special needs and learning difficulties under the direction of the Learning Support Coordinator and subject teachers.
- 5.2 Be an advocate for students with special needs and learning difficulties.
- 5.3 Participate and co-operate with all staff and act under the direction of the Head of College and senior staff.
- 5.4 Keep up to date observations and records as required by the Learning Support Coordinator.

6. Desired Outcomes

- 6.1 A learning environment which supports and empowers the target students is developed and maintained.
- 6.2 Special Needs students having equitable access to all facets of education provided by the school.
- 6.3 The College's policies and procedures are supported.
- 6.4 The person works and co-operates with all staff in a positive and collaborative manner.

7. Selection Criteria

- **SC1** Demonstrated skills which reflect commitment to, and an affinity for, children with learning difficulties and special needs.
 - 1. Experience and knowledge of the needs of secondary aged students with learning difficulties and special needs.
 - 2. Ability to listen to, relate to, and understand secondary age children with learning needs and respond accordingly.
 - 3. Ability to maintain a positive focused, well managed learning environment.
 - 4. Ability to prepare resources suitable for use with students of special needs.
 - 5. Ability to maintain records of students' learning and communicate these efficiently to fellow staff members with primary responsibility for the students' learning.

SC2 Demonstrated professional skills

- 1. Demonstrated basic computer skills.
- 2. Ability to develop professional relationships with children, staff, parents and members of the community.
- 3. Ability and commitment to work as a member of a team.
- 4. Demonstrated participation and willingness to participate in in-service and professional development.
- 5. Demonstrated knowledge of privacy and confidentiality policies.

SC3 Commitment to the Christian ethos of the college

- 1. Knowledge of the beliefs of the Christian church
- 2. Knowledge of the ethos of Lutheran schools
- 3. Willingness to commit to the Christian ethos of the college.

Knowledge and Qualifications

- Certificate III or IV in Education/Teacher Aide studies or working toward.
- Current certificate in First Aid (or be willing to gain this certificate).
- Current Blue Card for child related employment.
