Powerful Partnerships

Installation of the Junior Campus Leaders

All parents and visitors are invited to join us for the installation service of our Junior Campus leaders. This is an exciting time for our leaders as they step forward into their new roles as ambassadors for our College community. Please join us for a time of worship, celebration and acknowledgement as we commit these young men and women to Christ for the task ahead.

School Safety

The following points are some important safety reminders for our students, particularly around the internal and external roads of our school.

- Parents are to adhere to the speed limits within the school grounds.
- Parents and visitors are reminded to access the pedestrian crossings when crossing our internal and external roads.
- Parents using the Stop Kiss and Go zone are asked to move as far forward in the zone as possible to avoid traffic from backing up onto Rogers Parade more than is necessary.
- When collecting students from the Stop Kiss and Go zone, please ensure that the driver does not get out of the car as this can significantly slow the area down. Parents are asked to encourage their children quickly into the car and move out of the line with care and back onto the ring road.
- To assist the teachers on playground duty, please ensure that once you have collected your child/ ren from school that you maintain vigilance over their personal safety. Staff on duty are required to ask children to sit quietly while waiting in the after school areas. It is very difficult for the teachers on duty to distinguish between those families who have collected their children and those children still requiring supervision if children are moving freely around the undercover spaces.

Partnering with our Neighbours

- Please be mindful that our school is nestled in a suburban zone. The surrounding streets and cul-de-sacs have specific parking regulations.
- Out of courtesy to our neighbours please be careful not to double park, block driveways or linger any longer than necessary.
- Always be mindful of where your children are at all times, particularly once they step outside of the school grounds.
- No students are to be left unsupervised outside of the school grounds, particularly in the cul-desac across from the Rogers Parade Crossing.
- If students are not going to be collected promptly, they are to wait in the Stop Kiss and Go Zone under staff supervision.

School Uniforms and High Expectations

- It is expected that all students who are outside of the school grounds in their uniform will be wearing the full and correct uniform at all times.
- Student hair should be kept neat and tidy and in accordance with the College's Uniform Policy.

WEEKLY DEVOTION

Seeing the Hidden God

Last week, the students looked at 'impossible images' as part of our 'Inspirational Objects' focus for chapels and classroom devotions. There were some great responses including;

- God can always get things to happen
- Nothing is impossible for God
- Never give up on yourself.
- Believe in yourself and you can do anything.
- People see things in different ways

For me, the most amazing response came from one student on the Junior Campus who said, "Sometimes we can keep looking for God and not see him. Then suddenly, when we do, we can't not see him."

There are times when God can be hard to see. Like an impossible image, we can look and look, and wonder where he is. And that can lead to all sorts of doubts and self-doubts.

But what if there were some good reasons why God, at times, chooses to remain hidden.

Hidden for our protection. In the Old Testament, seeing God often led to death. Maybe, God hides from us as a sign of grace and mercy... sort of like a parent deliberately staying distant when a child does the wrong thing, so that the child can discover more about him or herself.

Hidden for the sake of relationship. Rules that are obeyed because someone is watching us don't change us. Real change occurs as we do things from the heart, rather than out of fear. Maybe, God remains hidden, at times, so that we can learn to love from the heart, rather than because we have to.

Hidden to be seen. The bible says that all who seek the Lord will find him. Maybe, God remains hidden, at times, so that we can look with great intent; like looking at the inkspot picture... there can be great joy when the image becomes clear.
